Step-by-Step: How to Register and Start

Step 1: Create a New Account

Go to the login page:

Click "Create new account" and complete the required fields to register.

Step 2: Confirm Your Email Address

After submitting your registration, you will receive an automated email from our system.

This email will:


- Ask you to confirm your email address.

Step 3: Enroll in a Course

Click the course, you find two enrollment options:
