The UNESCO World Heritage in Switzerland

A fascinating photographic journey through the natural and cultural treasures of our country

The UNESCO World Heritage testifies to the richness and diversity of our planet. A new short film produced in collaboration with Switzerland Tourism immerses viewers in these unique landscapes and cultural monuments.

There are 13 properties on the UNESCO World Heritage List in Switzerland, and they are probably among the most precious treasures that man and nature have left us. Together with Switzerland Tourism, World Heritage Experience Switzerland (WHES) searched for the most impressive images that these natural and cultural monuments have to offer. The result is an approximately 90-second film that induces the viewer to stop and embark on a virtual journey through Switzerland. From the watchmakers in the west to the ancient literary treasures in the east, one can see everything that distinguishes these places. Spectacular glacier images and dizzying aerial views reveal a new and sometimes unusual perspective. For each World Heritage property, the outstanding universal value that contributed to its designation on the UNESCO World Heritage List is shown. The video is available in four languages: German, French, Italian and English.
